Acts 2:1

When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place.

During our Lent groups and over Easter we have been thinking about some of the hard questions around when we feel distant from God or when we think God has let us down. We have reflected on the loss and bewilderment the disciples must have felt at Jesus crucifixion. Their loneliness with out him and

then there struggle to believe that he was alive again and what that might mean for them.

Sometimes, I confess, I am a bit envious of Thomas. I would love to have seen the risen Jesus put my hand on his and seen his wounds close up. Yet I also count myself in the group of those who 'who have not seen and yet have believed' (John 20:29) Of course that doesn't mean faith is easy, and in reality, like those early disciples, I'm no good at being brave on my own.

But then God knows this, and God had/has a solution:

And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability. (Acts 2:2-4)

The Holy Spirit, was poured out in a new way for those disciples. Poured out to take away their fear and to motivate them as disciples. The result of this was that they were transformed and could no longer keep quiet about the truth of Jesus and the gospel. They poured out of the room where they were hiding and told all who were there of Jesus love. Not even a difference in tradition, ethnicity or language would stop that.

You know, we too are not alone, Jesus hasn't left us by ourselves. This month we will celebrate the out pouring of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. But that celebration isn't just about remembering a historic event. For as God filled those first disciples God has also filled us all with the Holy Spirit. Not once, but many times over, and continues to do so.

God can take away our fear and transform us too into a people who can't help but show the love of Jesus in our lives, who can't keep quiet about Jesus and his gospel.

Hence my vision that everyone in the village and the communities we are part of should hear the name of Jesus. Then that may also give us the opportunity to share, as Peter did, what that means to our lives.

Come Holy Spirit, fall afresh on us.

A litter pick in the Village has been organised for Saturday 18th May at 1:30pm from the Axe and Compass car park, full details elsewhere in this newsletter. It will be good to see this worthwhile activity supported by Village folk.

Did you know?

Axe & Compass Development

The Axe and Compass was built in the 18th Century and since it's construction it has gone through a number of alterations as the business has changed and developed.

The Northern aspect of the building is little changed, although during the 19th Century it was extended to incorporate the house that belonged to Noah Green. During this period his family owned the Public House as well as a couple of farms in the village.

The Southern aspect has undergone significant modification having been extended in the 19th and 20th Centuries and a modern conservatory has also been added. The view of the building from this angle has changed greatly since its original construction.

The Public House has recently changed hands and the new owners are keen to develop it to achieve the aspirations of the recently approved Ringstead Neighbourhood Plan. The building is identified in the Plan as a feature of local heritage interest. The Plan also identifies 'tourism and the development of a higher value visitor economy' as 'a key economic opportunity for Ringstead'. As such any proposed changes need to balance the public benefit of the development against any visual alterations affecting the heritage value. The planned changes involve the



addition of four hotel rooms into the roof space requiring dormer windows to be added. This is not unknown in the Village as the old Tithe Farm constructed in 1610 had similar changes made to the roof without any objections. This also means that no changes will be made to the stonework

of the building. This is a fantastic opportunity for the Village to encourage tourism and also to provide accommodation for other visitors.




