From our Minister



I hate supermarket car parks! They are out to get me. I am convinced that they work in a similar way to crab or wasp traps: there is an easy way in, but no way out! I have been known to drive around a

car park several times before finding the all elusive exit. Now just when I have found my way out of Tesco at Kette-

ring they are altering theirs and I'm lost again! It should be easy, just follow the EXIT sign. But either I don't always spot them, or completely misunderstand them!



In our Christian life signs are important too. They point us to Christ and to the Father. Easter is full of such signs, as we can see through our Lent studies. Then we have Holy week, with the entry to Jerusalem, the last supper and of course the crucifixion and resurrection. Each important signs for us to follow, but (like those exit signs) sometimes easy to miss.

This is why it is important sometimes, to stop and take stock, or pause to look again at the significance of those events.

In the past we have paused on Maundy Thursday to think about the events of the last supper. This year we are changing things a bit and are inviting you to pause instead on the Saturday – traditionally known as Holy Saturday, when Jesus' body lay in the tomb.

We are going to hold an extra coffee morning, but also open the main chapel for reflection; there will be prayer stations with multi-sensory items to help you reflect on Jesus' journey to the cross and grave. There will also be a printed guide/reflection booklet to help your meditations, which you can then also take away.

I hope that in combination with our Lent groups this day will help you reflect on the Easter signs, and allow you space to (re)connect with the Father.

Did you know?

WEEE Collection

Here in Ringstead we are fortunate that every week our bin men pick up small household WEEE items left next to the wheeled bin in a carrier bag. North Northamptonshire is one of the few councils in the country that offers this service.

The term 'WEEE' means waste electrical and electronic equipment. This is anything that runs off electricity whether it be battery or mains powered. Small household items can range from hairdryers to mobile phones but larger items such as microwave ovens are not collected and should be taken to the local household waste recycling centre.



Waste electrical equipment often has components made of Lead, Mercury, and Cadmium which when placed in landfill sites can leach into groundwater. Eventually such pollution will find its way into the seas surrounding our



coast and damage aquatic ecosystems.

In addition to the pollution risks associated with this waste it also contains metals that can be reused. Typically Gold, Silver, Platinum, Palladium, Copper, Nickel, Cobalt, Aluminium and Steel can potentially be recovered. An average

Smartphone is estimated to house around 0.034g of Gold, 0.34g of Silver, 0.001g of Platinum, 0.015g of Palladium, 25g of Aluminium and 15g of Copper.

A mobile phone network company recently commissioned research that indicated there were possibly 55 million phones hidden away across the UK which would yield around 1.87 tonnes of Gold. This is worth nearly £100,000,000 in the current market.

So what happens to all the small electrical items that we put out for collection? These are sent to a company in Norwich for shredding and the shredded waste is then sent onto a specialist company for processing. This involves very strong magnets being used to remove certain metals and a twostage acid leaching process provides bulk separation of Copper and Gold. The remaining plastic granules are charged using a triboelectric charger, and then fed into an electric field for deflection and categorisation ready to be recycled.



Not A Tame Lion A Lent Course Based on the Writings of C. S. Lewis

This year's Lent course 'Not a Tame Lion' opens up the Bible using the popular Narnia films and their underlying Christian message. 
