From our Minister



I remember when I was young; it seemed that my mother and I had a strange spiritual connection. She would know when something significant had happened to me, even if we were miles apart. It would seem too that she could sense when things were wrong. On one occasion, when I was particularly upset, she asked me what the matter was. I was about to answer the normal teen answer 'Nothing'

when she said "I'm your mother. I gave birth to you, and I know you better than you know yourself, I know something is wrong!"

In an even deeper way, God knows us inside out too! King David wrote in Psalm 139, "You have searched me, Lord, and you know me. You know when I sit and when I rise; you perceive my thoughts from afar" (vv. 1–2). God's knowledge of us is so complete that David exclaimed, "Such knowledge is too wonderful for me, too lofty for me to attain" (v. 6). Yet instead of feeling exposed, David found comfort—there's nowhere we can go where we're beyond God's love and care (vv. 7–12). "Even there your hand will guide me," he wrote (v. 10).

David also marvelled at the mystery of life itself. Long before modern science explained the body's complexity; he celebrated God's creative power: "You knit me together in my mother's womb. I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made" (vv. 13–14). Everything about us—our bodies, our stories, even our hidden places - is known by the One who made us.

Knowing this should change the way we think about ourselves and how we pray. We can find comfort knowing that no matter where we are in life, when we call out to God in prayer, He'll offer us the love, wisdom and guidance we need. We can bring our blind spots, struggles, and joys to Him, knowing He already understands and welcomes us. And like David, our response can be awe and gratitude: "Your works are wonderful" (v. 14). Today, pause and rest in the truth that you are fully known and deeply loved by the God who created you.

Prayer:

Lord, I thank you that you know me completely and loving me without condition. Help me to rest in Your care, to trust You with my struggles, and to see myself through Your eyes. May my heart overflow with awe and gratitude for the wonderful work You have done in creating me. Amen.

Did you know?

1851 Religious Census

In 1841 the first comprehensive census of the population of Great Britain was taken and has been taken every ten years since. In 1851 a Religious Census was also taken at the same time as the population census; the first and only time this has been achieved and each church had to submit details about the church building and the numbers of people attending each church service.

The population of Ringstead in 1851 was 727.

The Religious Census for Northamptonshire has been archived and the figures for the three churches in Ringstead make interesting reading.

CHURCH.An ancient parish church. Consecrated long before 1800. Free*sittings

On 30th March 1851. In afternoon General Congregation 104, Sunday Scholars 73.

Remarks: Afternoon service always numerically superior to morning. Average about the same as above return in the afternoon. *Free sittings and pews are by general custom are so mixed as to render it difficult to separate them. Room for 450.

Signed T H Wilkins, Assistant Curate, Ringstead House (now the Manor House).

Thomas Hodsall Wilkins was assistant curate at Ringstead and Slipton. His father, also Thomas Wilkins, is recorded in the census as a Landed Proprietor and one of Her Majesty's Justice of the Peace. The Wilkins family were living in Ringstead in 1841 and 1851

WESLEYAN CHAPEL. Denomination Wesleyan Methodist. Erected 1814. A separate and entire building. Used exclusively for worship. Free sittings 70; other sittings 70. On 30th March 1851 In morning Sunday Scholars 27; in afternoon Total Congregation 64, in evening Total Congregation 110. Average attendance during previous 12 months, in morning General Congregation 180, Sunday Scholars 28. Signed Robert Childs, Trustee Ringstead near Thrapston

Robert Childs is described in a local directory as 'Shoemaker'.

BAPTIST MEETING. Denomination Particular Baptist. Erected before 1800. A separate and entire building. Used exclusively for worship. Free sittings 150; other sittings 190. On 30th March 1851

In morning General Congregation 109, Sunday Scholars 66, in afternoon General Congregation 159, Sunday Scholars 66, in evening General Congregation 183. Average attendance during previous 12 months, in morning General Congregation 110, Sunday Scholars 66, in afternoon General Congregation 170, Sunday Scholars 66, in evening General Congregation 00.

Signed William Kitchen, Minister, Ringstead, near Thrapston


