From our Minister



Sgt. Richard Kirkland was a Confederate soldier during the Civil War. On December 13, 1862, his unit fought behind the stone wall at Marye's Heights near Fredericksburg, Virginia, inflicting heavy losses on attacking Union troops. The next morning, over 8,000 Union soldiers lay dead or wounded on the field, many crying out in pain and thirst.

Hearing their suffering, Kirkland went to Brig. Gen. Joseph B. Kershaw and asked permission to help the wounded enemy. Kershaw at first refused, fearing he'd be shot, but eventually allowed it. When Kirkland asked if he could carry a white flag, Kershaw said no. Kirkland replied, "All right, sir, I'll take my chances."

Kirkland collected all the canteens he could carry, filled them with water, and walked onto the battlefield. For over an hour he gave water, blankets, and comfort to Union soldiers. Both sides soon realized what he was doing and held their fire. Kirkland continued until he had aided every wounded man—Confederate and Federal—within reach, earning the name "The Angel of Marye's Heights."

Many brave acts are carried out during wars—acts to hold back enemies, liberate captives, and bring aid to those in need. Although some of these stories are told, many are not. When we gather to "Remember them," we remember not only those who died, but also those who carried out such acts of bravery.

From our Minister - Cont'd

Few of us have ever—or will ever—face an enemy on the battlefield like that. Yet we still have those around us in need of help: the lonely, the poor, the sick, the dispossessed, and the refugee. We are called by the Gospel of Jesus to also become "angels" by helping whenever we can.

"If your enemy is hungry, feed him; if he is thirsty, give him something to drink." — Romans 12:20

In these days of fear and hate-inspired rhetoric, let us stand for something different—the love of Jesus.

Did you know?

Ringstead Public Houses

The current licensee of the Axe and Compass in Ringstead is Peter Sampson, in recent years we think of the running of a public house as being a full time activity. There used to be four public houses in Ringstead and very often they relied on a second job income to keep in business. The 1901 census returns show that Edward Lilley ran the Axe and Compass. The census tells us that Edward was a shoe and boot maker so his wife, Martha, was probably running the pub with the help of her daughter, Estelle Gaunt. In 1911 Harry Petitt is shown in charge and he was a clicker in the shoe trade so his wife likely ran the pub while he was working.

Further down Carlow Road was the Swan Inn, in 1851 Thomas Austin was the Landlord who was running a tailor's business as well as the pub, he was a young man aged 24 at the time; in 1871 he was recorded as being a baker and grocer in the village. In 1871 Amos Mason who was also a farmer of 9 acres in the village was running the pub and in 1881 his widow Jane was in charge. William Samuel Bull was shown as the next publican in 1891 and he ran his brazier (brass repair) business from the building. John Braybrook was the next incumbent in 1901, John was also a coal merchant.



The closure of the Black Horse in 1906 resulted in its ex landlord, William Robinson moving from High Street to the Swan. William was also a butcher and he set up business next door employing journeyman butcher, Arthur Yeomans, who had previously worked for him at the Black Horse. Elizabeth, his wife, looks to have played a significant role in running the pub.

As well as William Robinson in 1901, the Black Horse Inn (located in the High Street) was also run in 1881 by Elijah Robinson who was described as a publican, farmer of 12 acres and a carrier.

Also in the High Street was the New Inn which started trading in the 1860s. The pub was run by Carpenters up until the end of the 19th Century and they also took on the role of undertakers. The lounge bar of the inn was used for court hearings as well as preparing the dead for burial.



We discussed "The Life Impossible" by Matt Haig at our last meeting. We thought the book had a spiritual quality that we were not expecting.




